Vilhelm Lauritzen's graceful functionalist building, completed in 1928 and formerly a department store, was repurposed into a hotel in 2003 by architects Erik Møller. It received a major overhaul in 2017 by Hilde Aasbø of Norwegian studio Anemone Wille Våge, inspired by Lauritzen's selection of materials and colours, and the 288 rooms are more sumptuous than minimalist, with Moorish-style mouldings and upholstery

in velvet; the best have views over some of the prettiest parts of town, such as the 17th-century observatory Rundetaarn. The atrium lobby (above), with its maze-pattern floor and artwork by Superflex, Tal R, Bjørn Nørgaard and Adam Saks, is popular with locals, who come for a drink at the bar and for P Eatery's affordable New Nordic fare. *Krystalgade 22, T 3345 9100, www.sktpetri.com*
